




When to call

an ambulance





- Sudden, severe headache
- Sudden high fever
- Sudden dizziness, inability to stand w/o support
- One side of face is not moving or numb
- Crooked mouth or face when smiling
- Trouble speaking
- Narrow vision
- Sudden blurry vision
- Paleness
- Sudden, severe pain
- Sudden shortness of breath, difficulty breathing
- Painful tightness/pressure in chest for more than 2-3 min.
- Painful spots moving around
- Sudden sharp stomach pain
- Persistent severe abdominal pain
- Vomiting blood
- Blood in stool or black stool
- Sudden numbness
- Sudden loss of movement in one arm or leg

UNCONSCIOUSNESS

CONVULSIONS

- Fainting or loss of consciousness
- Fatigue
- Persistent seizures
- No recovery after a seizure ends
- PAIN / INJURY

 A cut that is gaping or bleeding a lot
 - Large burn area

VOMITING

Severe or persistent vomiting

CHOKING

ACCIDENTS

- Difficulty breathing, unconsciousness
- Traffic accident (strong impact)
- Drowning
- Falling from a high place
